ANNUAL CONFERENCE

Held annually, AVTE's annual conference brings over 400 members together for three days for networking, knowledge sharing, and tackling common challenges.

AVTE FELLOWS

AVTE Fellows designation allows members to obtain a title that reflects their outstanding commitment to promoting leadership, mentorship, and innovation within the veterinary technology education community.

MEMBERS COMMUNITY

A robust online community for AVTE members - it's a chance to get help with pressing challenges or help a colleague with theirs. There is a community specifically for program directors as well.

HOW THE ASSOCIATION OF VETERINARY TECHNICIAN EDUCATORS IS STRUCTURED:

THE BOARD

AVTE is governed by a Board of Directors. The Executive Committee of the Board (officers) manages affairs inbetween Board meetings.

COMMITTEES

The work of the Board is supported by a number of volunteer led committees and taskforces. Additional taskforces and work groups are appointed as needed by the Board.

APPOINTMENTS

Chairs and committee members are appointed by the President after Board consultation.

OPERATIONS

Day-to-day operations are handled by a management firm (TVD Associates, Inc.). Todd Von Deak serves as the AVTE's Executive Director

Types of Service

A variety of volunteer opportunities have been established in recognition of the interests and needs of busy professionals who wish to contribute. There are:

- Standing Committee(s). One-year commitment, renewable term.
- Ad Hoc Taskforce(s). Varied length commitment, short-term project, or research.
- Independent Project(s). Varied commitment, one-person project, or research.
- Mentoring Role(s). Varied length commitment to fulfill periodic needs.





How We Operate

All groups meet virtually (conference or video call).

- Groups will identify a person responsible for minutes. Minutes should be shared within 10 days of the meeting with the group (with a copy to the Executive Director). We suggest setting the day and time for the next meeting at the conclusion of the proceeding while the group is together.
- Meeting frequency varies by type of volunteer service.
- Volunteers are encouraged to share feedback with their chair, or our President on ways service can be meaningful on a personal level.

Our Ask of You

Is simple and straight forward.

- Maintain a current membership during your service
- Complete a conflict of interest and disclosure statement
- Participate in all meetings
- Review relevant material prior to meetings
- Accept and complete special assignments when possible
- Promote involvement by participating and being an advocate
- Respond promptly to correspondence and requests
- Immediately inform staff and leadership if your circumstances change that impact your service
